Despite the arrival of Native American and European settlers in the past few centuries, archaeological evidence suggests that human habitation of this region dates back to 10,000 B.C.

Early permanent settlers date back 2,000 years. The dominant Native American tribe in the region were the Potawatomi. Other influential tribes include the Winnebago (or Ho-Chunk), the Ojibwe, the Sauk, the Menominee, and the Ottawa.

In 1848, Wisconsin achieved statehood, and the peninsula was designated as part of Brown County.

The area began to witness the influence of prominent white settlers, including entrepreneur Asa Thorp, who constructed the dock at Fish Creek in 1855.

By 1850, an impressive volume of nearly 2,500 cords of wood were being shipped out of Baileys Harbor each year.

Finally, in 1851, Door County had gained a sufficient number of settlers to be established as an independent county. Early inhabitants primarily relied on timber and fishing for their livelihood. However, by 1900, excessive harvesting and improved transportation led to the growth of the tourism industry.

By 1920, significant improvements in roads made automobile travel more accessible than travel by boat, resulting in a surge in visitors to the area.

During both world wars, Door County's shipyards played a crucial role in producing military vessels for the nation.

In the late 1940s, cherry picking reached its zenith with approximately 10,000 workers employed in the orchards.

To delve deeper into this rich history, consider visiting a museum or embarking on a historical tour.



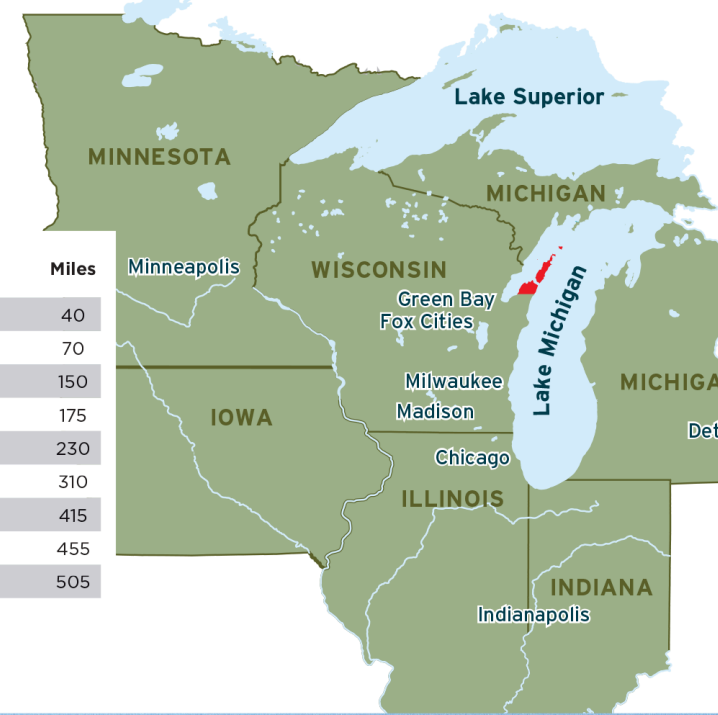

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
Check weather, pack proper equipment, know your limits and take precaution.



STICK TO THE TRAILS
Wonder at all of the natural beauty without wandering off the designated trails.



TRASH YOUR TRASH
Do not leave garbage or pet waste behind and recycle whenever possible.



KEEP WILDLIFE WILD
Do not feed wildlife, give them plenty of space and learn about hunting seasons and local fishing regulations.



LEAVE IT AS YOU FIND IT
Do not remove or interfere with anything you find in parks and brush off your shoes and tires to prevent spreading invasive species.



BE CAREFUL WITH FIRE
Always burn fire safely, extinguish it fully and only use firewood sourced within 15 miles.

DEATH'S DOOR

Door County derives its name from the French phrase "Port des morts," meaning "Death's Door." This symbolic name honors the hazardous strait that stretches between the northern edge of the peninsula and Washington Island, encapsulating the intriguing maritime history of the region.

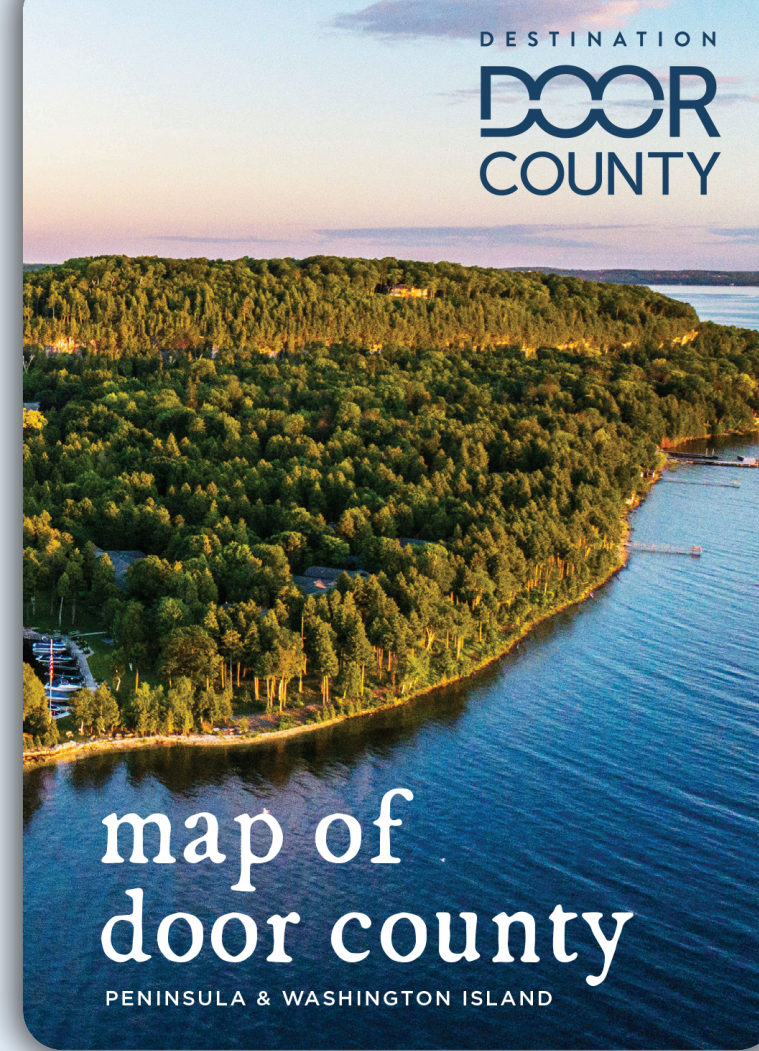
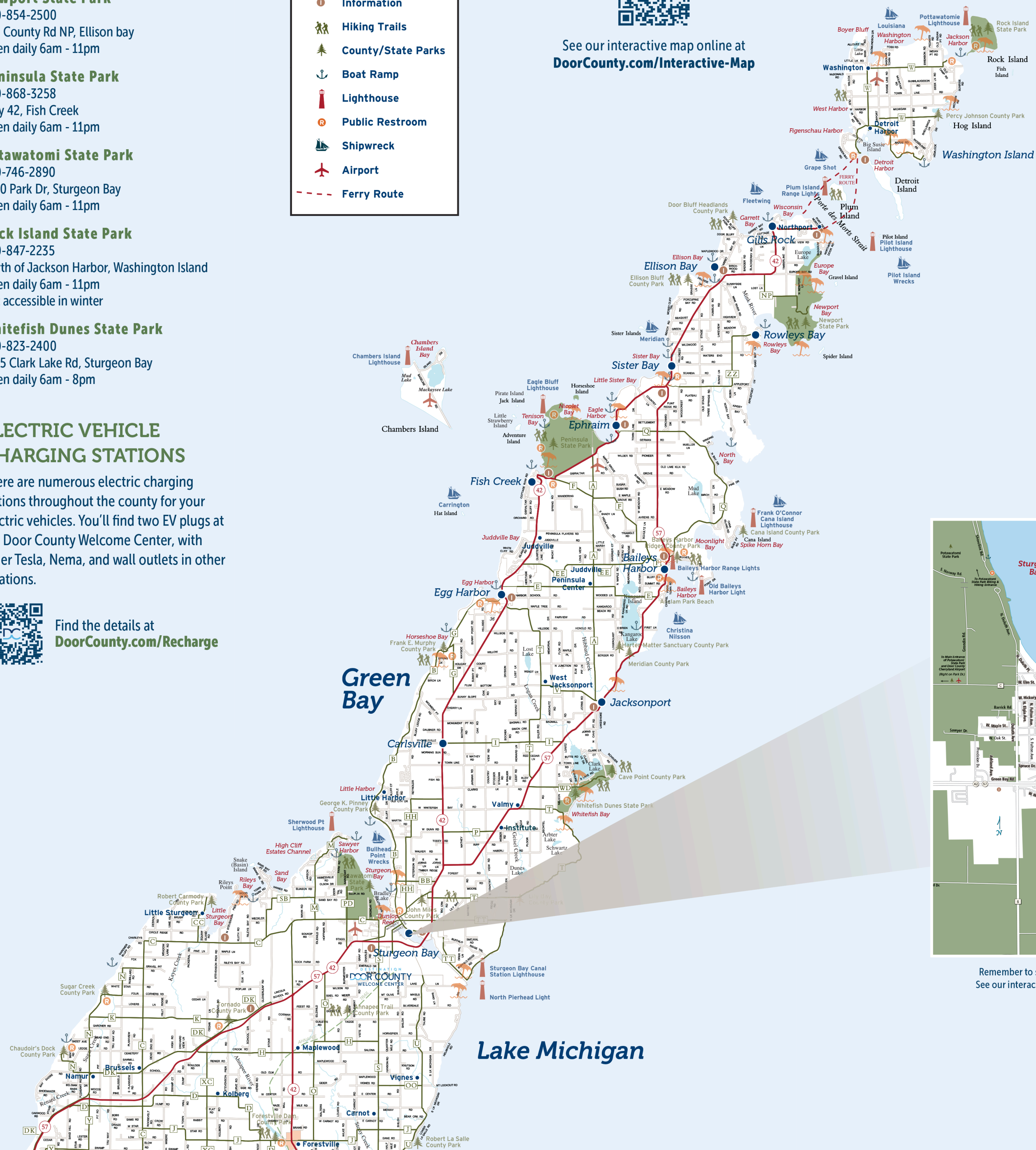

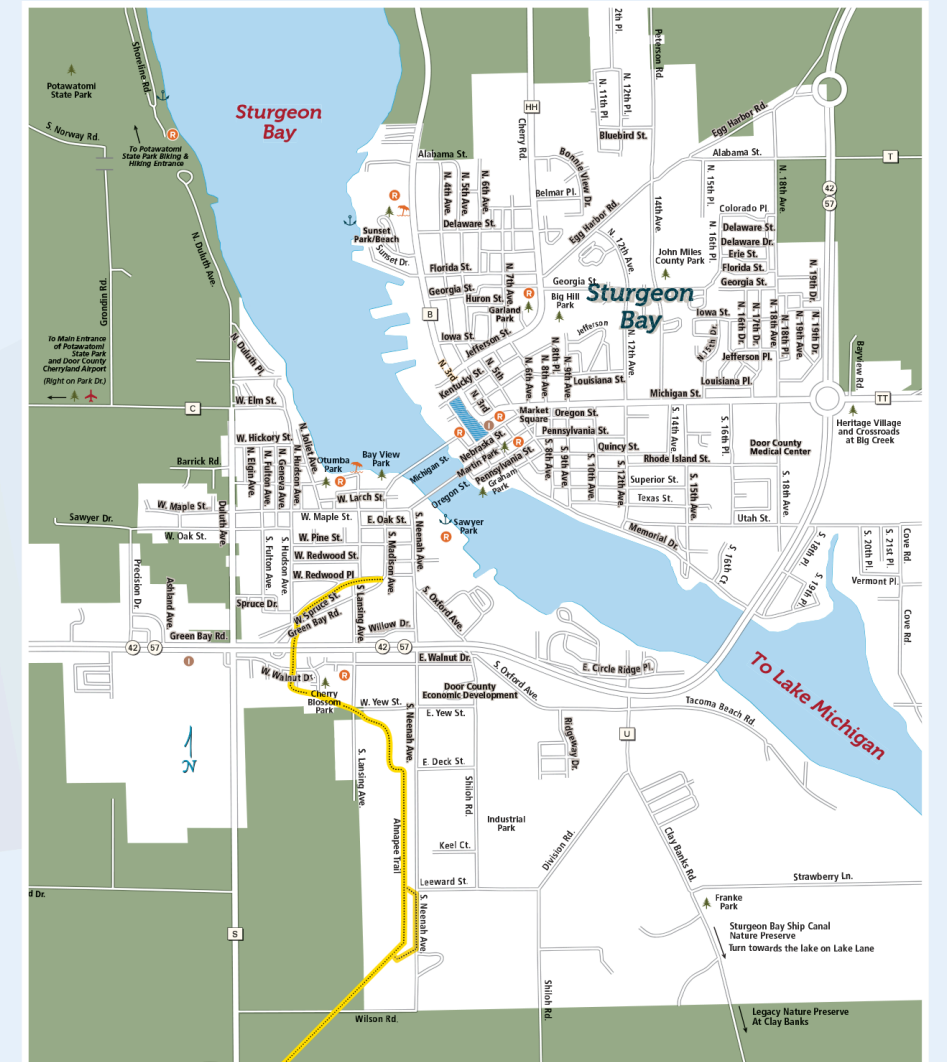
